TODAY, MARCH 27, is the last day to drop a course, so this is a good time to review our policy about

the drop date (past the 9^{th} week – TODAY) unless there is an extenuating circumstance beyond the student's control.

These are $\underline{\text{NOT}}$ extenuating circumstances: student has changed mind about major or minor student is doing poorly in the class

Late drop requests are handled according to the College policy. We $\underline{\text{DO NOT}}$ approve drops past

late drops.

student is working and doesn't have time for the class student has now realized that the class is difficult

student has decided she/he doesn't need/want/like/agree with the class

- a death in the immediate family of the student student has been in an accident and is unable to attend
- Extenuating circumstances would be things such as:

If there are extenuating reasons, the student must complete the "Request for Exception to the Drop Policy" form and provide documentation. Remember to check with YOUR dean's office to verify these same extenuating circumstances apply to
