

General Education Approved Exceptions

Science Inquiry

Students classified as TRANSFER students who bring in 2 different general education science lab courses may count that combination as having met their Science Inquiry requirement. Only those courses already approved for inclusion in the Science Inquiry perspective are allowed. For example, BIO 1101 and CHE 1101 & 1110 will meet the requirement even though they are not in the same perspective. **This applies only to TRANSFER students, NOT freshman with transfer credit!**



Sophomore Writing Requirement

ENG 1100 was an acceptable substitution for ENG 2001 ONLY during the 2009-2010 academic year. Students who took or had transfer credit for ENG 1100 during that time period may use it to meet the ENG 2001 credit. All other students must take or have transfer credit for ENG 2001. (WGC 2001 is an appropriate course for meeting this requirement.)

Wild Card Policy for Perspectives

This policy applies to the Aesthetic, Historical & Social, and Local to Global perspectives only. There are actually three separate policies. **The wild card policies apply to TRANSFER students only, not freshmen with transfer credit!**

1. Students who transfer in courses in two different themes within the same perspective may take one more course in either theme to complete that perspective as their 9 hour perspective.
2. Students who transfer in two courses in one theme and one course in another theme all within the same perspective will be considered to have completed that 9 hour perspective.
3. Students who transfer in one course in one theme within a perspective but are required to take a course for their major that is in another theme within the same perspective may take the course required for the major AND one more course in the same theme to complete a 9 hour theme for the perspective. NOTE: If the student then changes the major, the student will have to complete nine hours within a single theme.
